CURRENT STATUS SUMMARY:				
Aung Myo Oo was arrested for his involvement in a protest against the new education bill. He is now facing trial as of March 11, in Letpadan court. Currently, he is detained in the Tharawaddy Prison.				
CAREER BACKGROUND:				
Aung Myo Oo is a social activist as well as a member of NLD youth. He was imprisoned for one month in November 25, 2013 by Kemmedine, Ahlone and Sanchaung Township Courts, under Section 18 of the Peaceful Assembly Peaceful Procession Act. His arrest was due to his involvement in the anti-Letpadaung copper mine protest in December 2012. He was incarcerated in Insein prison.				
ARREST DETAILS:				
2015: On March 10, Aung Myo Oo was arrested for his involvement in a protest for education reform in Letpadan, Pegu Division, and detained in Tharawaddy Prison. He is being held under Sections 143 (being a member of an unlawful assembly), 145 (joining or continuing in the unlawful assembly), 147 (rioting), 332 (causing harm to a public servant in the discharge of his duty), and 505(b) of the Penal Code. The prosecutor for the case is Police Major Bhone Myint from Letpadan police station. The judge is U Myat Kyaw.				
DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT:				
2015: Remains incarcerated as of writing.
