<b>CURRENT STATUS SUMMARY:</b>	Hein Zaw Win was arrested on March 10, for his participation in the student protest against the National Education Law. He has been detained in Tharawaddy Prison and is now facing trial as of 11 March, in Letpadan court.			
<b>CAREER BACKGROUND:</b>	Hein Zaw Win was a student at Mandalay University who graduated with Bachelors in Business Law. He is also a leader of ABFSU and a social activist. Hein Zaw Win was previously indicted in 2013, under the Peaceful Assembly and Peaceful Procession Law for protesting against the Letpadaung Copper Mining Project.			
<b>ARREST DETAILS:</b>	<b>2015:</b> On March 10, Hein Zaw Win was arrested due to his participation in the protest for education reform in Letpadan, Pegu Division, and detained in Tharawaddy Prison. He is being held under Sections 143 (being a member of an unlawful assembly), 145 (joining or continuing in the unlawful assembly), 147 (rioting), 332 (causing harm to a public servant in the discharge of his duty), and 505(b) of the Penal Code.  Prosecutor for the case is Police Major Bhone Myint from Letpadan police station. The judge is U Myat Kyaw.			
<b>DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT:</b>	<b>2015:</b> Remains incarcerated as of writing.
