Honey Oo's health condition is not good in Thayawady Prison. She has been denied access to a specialist doctor.				
CURRENT STATUS SUMMARY:				
Honey Oo was arrested with other student leaders and has been detained in Thayawady Prison. She is facing trial for her involvement in advocating for reform of the National Education Law in Letpadan.				
CAREER BACKGROUND:				
<p>Her father, U Htun Oo, is a lawyer as well as an 88 former political prisoner who had been charged and sentenced two times for his political activities. In 2007, Honey Oo was a member of a group who reformed the All Burma Federal Students Union. She is no stranger to political imprisonment. In 2007 during the Saffron Revolution, She was accused of participation in the demonstration and charged with Disloyalty Act 124/a, Unlawful Association Act 6, Unlawful Assembly Act 143, Continuing Unlawful Assembly Act 145, and brought to Eastern district court in Tamwe Township, Rangoon. At that time, she was a final year law major student in Dagon University. She was denied her request to sit her final exams in order to complete her Law degree.</p> <p>Honey Oo was incarcerated from 2008 to 2012, spending 4 years and three months in prison for staging protests against military rule. She was released in January 13, 2012 and stated that she will continue working as an ABFSU member and she will do everything she can for students.</p>				
ARREST DETAILS:				
2015: On March 13, Honey Oo was arrested during the Education Reform Protest in Letpadan, Pegu Division, and detained in Thayawady Prison. She is being held under sections 143 (being a member of an unlawful assembly), 145 (joining or continuing in the unlawful assembly), 147 (rioting), 332 (causing harm to a public servant in the discharge of his duty), and 505(b) of the Penal Code.				
Prosecutor for the case is Police Major Bhone Myint from Letpadan police station. The judge is U Myat Kyaw.				

DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT:
2015: Remains incarcerated as of writing.
