CURRENT STATUS SUMMARY:			
<p>In October 2014, Ye Yint Aung, Ko Aung and Zaw Win were sentenced to 3 months imprisonment under Section 18. Nay Win was facing trial under Section 505(b). They were also still facing trial at Madaya Township Court. Upper Lawyer's Network Burma is representing.</p> <p>On December 30, 2014, they were sentenced to one more year imprisonment under section 505 (b) respectively. Ye Yint Aung, Ko Aung, Zaw Win and Nay Win are still in Obo, Mandalay prison.</p>			
CAREER BACKGROUND:			
ARREST DETAILS:			
2014: After they participated in a ploughing protest in Madaya, Mandalay on 1 March, on land that had been confiscated by the government, which was attended by over 100 farmers. The next morning, on 2 March, police informed the four that they had been charged with trespassing and vandalism.			
They had their charges upgraded to sedition charges under section 505(b). Ye Ying Aung and Zaw Win were arrested on 11 April and were taken into custody in Mandalay's Obo Prison.			
DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT:			
In October 2014, Ye Yint Aung, Ko Aung and Zaw Win were sentenced to 3 months imprisonment under Section 18. In December 2014, they were sentenced to one more year imprisonment under section 505 (b) respectively.
