CURRENT STATUS SUMMARY: Hlaing court refused him to give bill on the 15 October and sent him to Insein Prison. Next court trail day will be on the 27 October.				
CAREER BACKGROUND: He is a development and humanitarian worker in various INGOs and UN Agencies since 2000 such as MSF-Holland, Enfants Du Monde France, Malteser International, HIV Project at United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), Communications Consultant for Programme Communication and Information Section (PCIS) at UNICEF, Water and Sanitation Section at UNICEF, Trocaire and USAID project funded through OTI (DAI) called ADAPT.				
ARREST DETAILS: On October 14 around 6:45 pm, 4 police and one ward authority came to the apartment he lived with 3 children and paralyzed old mother. They showed him a printed A4 paper appearing the photo of unidentified person stepping on a photo of Military Commander in Chief Senior General Min Aung Hlaing. He was arrested without a warrant and taken to Hlaing Township police station for questioning. His phone and computer were confiscated when he was arrested, and he was charged under the 2013 Telecommunication Law, which carries a maximum sentence of three years in prison.				
DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT: He is now staying in Building 5, Room 5 at Insein Prison since 15 October 2015.
