| <p>Kyaw San; Myo Thu Htut; U Kyaw and Maung Maung Toe and Wunna organised a demonstration in Prome [Pyay] Pegu Division on 4 August to demonstrate against enacting a Proportional Representation Voting System for the countries elections.</p> <p>Kyaw San stated that permission for the demonstration had been requested the Friday before the demonstration but had been rejected on the basis that permission should be requested no less than 5 days before the demonstration is due to take place.</p> <p>MyoMyint (Prome Police Station Superintendent) informed them on 5 August 2014 that legal action was going to be taken against them and that they face charges under Section 18 of the Peaceful Assembly and Peaceful Procession Act.</p> <p>On 20 August 2014 they had a court hearing and were granted bail with parole.</p> <p>If the 5 are found guilty, they will face either 6 months imprisonment or a fine of 30,000 Kyat (\$30).</p> <p>Robert San Aung (lawyer representing the 5) stated that he believes that charges brought against the 5 are illegal as they are going against the newly amended law – the authorities should not be allowed to deny permission to protest, the Union Parliament has made this clear.</p> <p><a href="#">6 August 2014 - DVB</a></p> |   |                   |  |                    |
