<b>CAREER BACKGROUND:</b>	Su Su Nway is a member of the National League for Democracy and has been imprisoned as a political prisoner previously. She became the first Burmese national to successfully sue local government officials in 2005 under the 1999 Forced Labour Law.			
<b>ARREST DETAILS:</b>	<b>2014:</b> Su Su Nway organised a large-scale protest in Pyin Oo Lwin, Mandalay on 16 June over land grabs without getting prior permission. Over 1500 farmers attended the protest. On 17 June, police informed Su Su Nway in writing that she had been charged under Article 18 and summoned her to the police station. Su Su Nway responded that she would not be complying with the instructions. As of 18 July she had not yet been arrested. <a href="#">19 June 2014 - DVB</a>
