| On January 18, Dagon Seikkan Township Police arrested Naung Naung and Lay Lay a.k.a San San, supporters of Former Child Soldier Aung Ko Htwe, under Section 505(b) of the Penal Code and sent them to the Insein Prison. They were arrested for staging a protest for abolishing the 2008 Constitution after Dagon Seikkan Township Court had decided to prosecute Aung Ko Htwe on January 17. Dagon Seikkan Township Court issued a warrant against Aung Ko Htwe's sister Nay Zar Tun, Zaw Gyi, Khin Cho Naing and Than Than Htwe, who were involved in the protest. | | | |
| DETAILS OF IMPRISONMENT: | | | |

On September 11, Dagon Seikkan Township court in Rangoon sentenced Naung Naung and Lay Lay a.k.a San San to a year in prison. Judge made a decision after nine months detention. On August 16, Dagon Seikkan Township Court decided to prosecute them under Section 153 and Section 505(b) of the Penal Code. Although their lawyer applied for a bail, government's legal officer denied this.
